NOTICE TO BIDDERS

**WATER POLLUTION CONTROL PLANT REHABILITATION
PROJECT NO. 08-593-52-239

1. **BID OPENING:** The bidder shall complete and **submit the blue copy** of the “Proposal to the City of San Leandro” form that is inserted in the Contract Book. No other copy of the Proposal Section will be accepted. Sealed bids containing said blue copies of the completed Proposal Section subject to the conditions named herein and in the specifications for “**Water Pollution Control Plant Rehabilitation Project, Project No. 08-593-52-239,**” addressed to the **City of San Leandro** will be received at **City Hall, 835 East 14th Street, 2nd Floor San Leandro** at the office of the **City Clerk** up to **3:00 p.m.** on **Tuesday, April 05, 2011**, at which time they will be publicly opened and read.
2. **BID RESULTS:** A summary of the bids received will be made available, via the Internet, at: www.ci.san-leandro.ca.us/slpurchasingbids.html
3. **WORK DESCRIPTION:** The work to be done includes, but not limited to, demolition of existing facilities, new headworks and influent pump station, new grit facility, primary clarifier nos. 1 and 2 improvements, new primary clarifier no. 3, new fixed-film reactor, new biofilter odor control facilities, secondary clarifier nos. 1 and 2 improvements, equalization tank nos. 1 to 3 improvements, new equalization basin, digester nos. 1 and 2 improvements, administration control building (Bid Alternative A), civil and yard facilities improvements, landscaping improvements, electrical system improvements, instrumentation and control system improvements, and doing all appurtenant work in place and ready for use, all as shown on the plans and described in the specifications with the title indicated in paragraph 1 above, and on file in the office of the **Engineer**. Reference to said plans and specifications is hereby made for further particulars.
4. **CONTRACTOR’S LICENSE:** A Class “**A**” **General Engineering** Contractor’s License is required for this work. If the bid alternate for the Administration Control Building work is accepted, a Class “**B**” **General Building** Contractor’s License is also required by the General Contractor or Subcontractor. No bid will be accepted from a contractor who has not been licensed in accordance with Chapter 9 Division 3 of the Business and Professional Code.
5. **BID DEPOSIT:** A Bid Deposit equal to at least 10% of the total amount of the bid shall be placed in the sealed proposal. The Bid Deposit shall be in one of the following forms: cash, cashier’s check or certified check payable to the City, or bidder’s bond in favor of the City executed by an authorized surety company.

6. PAYMENT AND PERFORMANCE BONDS: Payment and performance guarantee bonds as set forth in Section 00700-2.4 “Contract Bonds” will be required from the successful bidder.
7. CITY’S RIGHT TO REJECT BIDS: The right is reserved, as the interest of the City may require, to reject any or all bids, or to waive any informality or minor irregularity in the bids.
8. GENERAL PREVAILING WAGE RATES: The City Council has ascertained the general prevailing rate of wages applicable to the work to be done. A tabulation of the various classifications of work persons to be employed and the prevailing rate of wages applicable thereto is on file in the **City Clerk’s** office.
9. FEDERAL MINIMUM WAGE RATES. The Davis Bacon Federal Labor Standards Apply to this project. Attention is directed to the Federal Minimum Wages included in these Special Provisions. If there is a difference between the minimum wage rates predetermined by the Secretary of Labor and the general prevailing wage rates determined by the Director of the California Department of Industrial Relations for similar classifications of labor, the Contractor and subcontractors shall pay not less than the higher wage rate. The Department will not accept lower State wage rates not specifically included in the Federal minimum wage determinations. This includes “helper” (or other classifications based on hours of experience) or any other classification not appearing in the Federal wage determinations. Where Federal wage determinations do not contain the State wage rate determination otherwise available for use by the Contractor and subcontractors, the Contractor and subcontractors shall pay not less than the Federal minimum wage rate, which most closely approximates the duties of the employees in question.
10. OBTAINING THE PROJECT PLANS AND CONTRACT BOOK: A Bidder’s Set consisting of:
 - a. Volume 1 – Divisions 0 through 10 of the Project Specifications
 - b. Volume 2 – Divisions 11 through 15 of the Project Specifications
 - c. Volume 3 - Divisions 16 and 17 of the Project Specifications
 - d. Volume 4 – 11”x17” reduced size set of the Project Plans
 - e. Volume 5 – 11”x17” reduced size set of the Project Plans
 - f. CD consisting of PDF files of Volume 1 thru 5 of the plans and specifications.

may be purchased at the **Kiosk Counter** of the Community Development Department, City Hall, 835 East 14th Street, 1st Floor, San Leandro, **(510) 577-3423**, upon payment of a non-refundable fee of **\$150.00 (payable by exact cash or check only)** for each set. This fee applies to pick-ups by Purchaser and to FedEx Shipments (at Purchaser’s expense).

Contractor may purchase additional bid sets from East Bay Blue at Contractor’s expense.

Purchasing of plans directly from East Bay Blueprint and Supply Company without purchasing a bidder’s set from the City will not establish the firm on the bidder’s list. Firms not purchasing a bidder’s set from the City will not be notified of issued addenda or other project related notices, if any.

11. **FUNDING:** This project is being constructed with funding from the Clean Water State Revolving Fund Program. Bidders and Contractors will be required to comply with the requirements of this program which are included in these contract documents. These requirements include, but are not limited to, the Davis Bacon Act and Disadvantage Business Enterprise requirements.
12. **WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSALS:** Any bid may be withdrawn at any time prior to the time fixed in the public notice for the opening of bids only by written request for the withdrawal of the bid filed with the **City Clerk**. The request shall be executed by the bidder or its duly authorized representative. The withdrawal of a bid does not prejudice the right of the bidder to file a new bid. Whether or not bids are opened exactly at the time fixed in the public notice for opening bids, a bid will not be received after that time nor may any bid be withdrawn after the time fixed in the public notice for opening of bids.
13. **RELIEF OF BIDDERS:** As stated in Public Contract Code Sections 5100 to 5108, inclusive concerning relief of bidders and in particular to the requirement therein, that if the bidder claims a mistake was made in the bid presented, the bidder shall give the **City Clerk**, written notice within five (5) days after the opening of the bids of the alleged mistake, specifying in the notice in detail how the mistake occurred.
14. **DISQUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS:** More than one proposal from an individual, firm, partnership, corporation, or combination thereof under the same or different names will not be considered. Reasonable grounds for believing that any individual, firm, partnership, corporation, or combination thereof is interested in more than one proposal for the work contemplated may cause the rejection of all proposals in which such individual, firm, partnership, corporation, or combination thereof is interested. If there is reason for believing that collusion exists among the bidders, any or all proposals may be rejected. Proposals in which the prices obviously are unbalanced may be rejected.
15. **PREVIOUS DISQUALIFICATION, REMOVAL, OR OTHER PREVENTION OF BIDDING:** A bid may be rejected on the basis of a bidder, any officer of such bidder, or any employee of such bidder who has a proprietary interest in such bidder, having been disqualified, removed, or otherwise prevented from bidding on, or completing a federal, state, or local project because of a violation of any law or any safety regulation.
16. **RESPONSIBILITY FOR VERIFYING CONTRACT ADDENDA:** All bidders shall verify if any addenda for this project have been issued by the City of San Leandro. It is the bidders' responsibility to ensure that all requirements of contract addenda are included in the bidder's proposal. All bidders shall include a signed copy of all contract addenda with the proposal. Failure to comply with this requirement shall cause the proposal to be considered as non-responsive and shall be grounds for rejection of the bid.
17. **SITE INVESTIGATION:** The bidder shall examine carefully the site of the work to verify all existing conditions. The submission of a bid shall be conclusive evidence that the bidder has investigated and is satisfied as to the conditions to be encountered, as to the character, quality, and scope of work to be performed, as to the quantities of materials to be furnished, and as to the requirements of the proposal, plans, specifications, and the contract. The bidder shall not take advantage of any apparent error or omission in the plans or specifications. In

the event the bidder discovers any apparent error, discrepancy, or omission as a result of its site investigation, bidder shall immediately notify the City.

18. PRE-BID CONFERENCE: A pre-bid conference will be held on February 23, 2011, at 10:00 a.m. at the City's Water Pollution Control Plant, 3000 Davis Street, San Leandro, CA 94577. Contractors will be allowed to tour the plant during this time. A bidder who fails to attend a pre-bid conference will be held responsible for any information that could have been reasonably deduced from said attendance. Attendance is strongly encouraged.

The Water Pollution Control Plant will be available for escorted tours on the following days from 10:00am to 12:00pm. At these tours, bidders will be permitted to inspect the facilities but no questions regarding the contract documents will be answered. Guides will not operate equipment or permit access to equipment in operation or that is deemed to be unsafe to do so.

Questions regarding the plans and specifications may be submitted in writing to the project manager until 5:00 p.m., fourteen (14) calendar days before, excluding Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays, bids are due. The City will not respond to oral questions outside of the pre-bid conference. The response, if any, will be by written addendum only. Oral responses do not constitute a revision to these plans or specifications.

19. ENGINEER'S ESTIMATE: The Engineer's Estimate of construction for this project (including Bid Alternative A) is \$43 million to \$48 million.
20. PUBLIC CONTRACT CODE SECTION 22300: Pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 22300, for monies earned by the Contractor and withheld by the City to ensure the performance of the Contract, the Contractor, may, at its option, choose to substitute securities meeting the requirements of said Public Contract Code Section 22300.
21. CALIFORNIA LABOR CODE SECTION 6707: Pursuant to the provisions of California Labor Code Section 6707, each bid submitted in response to this Notice to Bidders shall contain, as a bid item, adequate sheeting, shoring, and bracing, or equivalent method, for the protection of life and limb in trenches and open excavation, which shall conform to applicable safety orders. By listing this sum, the bidder warrants that its action does not convey tort liability to the City or City employees, engineers, agents, or subconsultants.
22. NOT USED:
23. BID PROTEST PROCEDURES: Any protest of the proposed award of bid to the bidder deemed the lowest responsible bidder must be submitted in writing to the City no later than 5:00 p.m. on the third (3rd) business day following the date of the bid opening.

The initial protest must contain a complete statement of the basis for the protest.

The protest must state the facts and refer to the specific portion of the document or the specific statute that forms the basis for the protest. The protest must include the name, address, and telephone number of the person representing the protesting party.

The party filing the protest must concurrently transmit a copy of the initial protest to the bidder deemed the lowest responsible bidder.

The party filing the protest must have actually submitted a bid on the project. A subcontractor of a party filing a bid on this project may not submit a Bid Protest. A party may not rely on the Bid Protest submitted by another bidder, but must timely pursue its own protest.

The procedure and time limits set forth in this Section are mandatory and are the bidder's sole and exclusive remedy in the event of a Bid Protest. The bidder's failure to fully comply with these procedures shall constitute a waiver of any right to further pursue the Bid Protest, including filing of a challenge of the award pursuant to the California Public Contracts Code, filing of a claim pursuant to the California Government Code, or filing of any other legal proceedings.

The City shall review all timely protests prior to formal award of the bid. The City shall not be required to hold an administrative hearing to consider a timely protest, but may do so at the option of the Engineer, or if otherwise legally required. At the time of the City Council's consideration of the award of the bid, the City Council shall also consider the merits of any timely protests and the Engineer's recommendation thereon. The City Council may either accept the protest and award the bid to the next lowest responsible bidder, or reject the protest and award to the lowest responsible bidder. Nothing in this section shall be construed as a waiver of the City Council's right to reject all bids.

The City reserves the right to waive any bid irregularities not affecting the amount of the bid, except where such waiver would give the low bidder an advantage or benefit not allowed other bidders.
