Council Information

Public Safety Staffing for 4th of July Holiday

- For the upcoming 4th of July holiday, the San Leandro Police Department (SLPD) will have increased patrol staffing and take a "zero tolerance" stance on fireworks. Police Officers will respond to calls regarding fireworks activity as necessary and as other emergency calls allow.
- All fireworks, including safe and sane fireworks, are illegal. It is illegal to possess, store, offer for sale, expose for sale, sell at retail, use, or explode any fireworks, including "safe and sane" fireworks as defined in the California State Health and Safety Laws. The intent of the law is to prevent injury, maintain order in our neighborhoods, prevent fire or damage to structures and/or vegetation. Officers will be enforcing all laws and the San Leandro Municipal Code when dealing with firework related incidents. Below are the specifics on closures/extra patrol:
 - SLPD staffing for the 4th of July holiday beyond normal staffing will include additional officers to work foot patrol in the parks, downtown bicycle patrol and additional patrol staffing to handle fireworks related calls.
 - One Community Service Officer (CSO) is assigned to work a crime prevention/information booth at the F.H. Daily Chevrolet July 4th [Community Fair](#) at 800 Davis Street.
 - SLPD will close Marina Park beginning at 7:00 p.m. and the park will be fully closed at 8:00 p.m.
