2012 Flu Shot Clinics (flyer attached)

Mondays, October 8 & 15, 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., Senior Community Center, 13909 East 14th Street

- The annual Flu Shot Clinics will be held on **October 8 and October 15**. This service is offered in partnership with Sutter Care at Home, formerly known as Sutter Visiting Nurse Association and Hospice (VNA). Sutter is receiving free vaccines from the county this year, so flu shots are only \$5.00 per person. There is no cost for those covered by Medicare Part B; Sutter will bill Medicare for payment. Pneumonia shots will be available for \$60, Preservative – Free shots (for those pregnant or allergic to thimerosal) for \$30, and Flu Mist (for ages 2-49) for \$30. The fee is established by Sutter Care at Home, which is a non-profit organization, and the City receives no money.

Council Information

San Leandro Submits an Application for the Bloomberg Foundation's Mayor's Challenge

- Earlier today, the City submitted the Lit San Leandro project to the "Mayor's Challenge," an initiative of the NYC Mayor Michael Bloomberg's Foundation to find and spread innovative local solutions to national problems. The five boldest ideas with the greatest potential for impact will win funding as well as national and local recognition.
- Although the competition for funding is fierce with roughly 400 cities participating, this application provides an opportunity for San Leandro to promote the innovative nature of the Lit San Leandro public-private partnership as a model for other communities.

Design Experts Sought for Shoreline Advisory Group

- The City is seeking three individuals with expertise in design or architecture to join the San Leandro Shoreline Advisory Group (SAG). The SAG currently consists of 21-members from the former Shoreline Development Citizens Advisory Committee which worked over three years with the City and Cal-Coast Development to create a Comprehensive Master Plan for the shoreline area. The SAG meets on the third Wednesday of the month from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. on an as-needed basis and has met once since City Council ratification of its members June 4, 2012. Polystyrene Takeout Containers Banned in November

- The Recycling Program continues to conduct outreach for the upcoming the Polystyrene Foam Food Service Ware Ordinance, effective November 1, 2012. In the last few months, the Recycling Program has conducted the following activities:
 - Placed advertisements regarding the Polystyrene Foam Food Service Ware ban in the *San Leandro Times* on July 5, July 26, August 16, and August 30
 - Sent a letter to food establishments on August 27
 - Sent a letter to retailers of polystyrene foam products encouraging them to offer alternatives to their customers
 - Emailed City staff about requirements at City facilities and City-sponsored events
 - Placed information in Recreation Guide (Fall Edition – Page 11)
 - Placed information on the main page of the City website under “City News”
 - Placed information about the ordinances as Calendar Items on City Website
 - Distribute outreach at the Farmers Market – 2nd Wednesday of the month (May – October)
 - Sent information to the San Leandro Chamber of Commerce to distribute to members
 - Emailed approximately 500 subscribers on our Recycling Program list
 - Distributed information to 1500 participants at the Compost Giveaway
 - Updated the Recycling Program website (<http://www.sanleandro.org/depts/pw/es/takeout.asp>)
- Within the next month we are planning to distribute outreach at City events, notify Home Owners Associations, place an insert in ACI bills for fall distribution, issue a press release, and continue to place advertisements in the *San Leandro Times*.

Police Department Open House A Success (picture attached)

- The Police Department hosted an Open House on September 7 as a community outreach effort. “More than 750 people attended the Open House. There were a lot of positive interactions and great community feedback. The event exceeded expectations and was impressive!” said Chief Spagnoli.
- The Open House included tours of the Police Department, information booths, jail and building tour, a BBQ hosted by the POA, a K-9 demo, Alameda County Fire Department booth and a rappel demonstration by S.W.A.T. Member Mark Clifford. The first 100 people that attended received a SLPD drawstring backpack. People were lined up at 4:45 p.m. The grand prize drawing was a training session for two with the S.W.A.T. team, which was won by Jenny Anderson of Oakes Boulevard.

Exercise Equipment at Marina Park (picture attached)

- Prior to the purchase and installation of the new exercise equipment at the parcourse, Recreation and Public Works staff visited several different installations of outdoor exercise equipment around the Bay Area. Staff was focused on finding sturdy equipment that would withstand the marine environment and heavy usage, and a manufacturer with a proven track record.
- The wooden exercise stations around the par course are performing well, whereas the metal apparatus with moving parts, clustered at the entrance to the parcourse, have not held up well. To date, four of the five exercise stations with moving parts have broken. The manufacturer has been very good about listening to staff's suggestions, redesigning the failed equipment and providing new, redesigned replacement equipment under warranty.

- Although the equipment failures to date have been covered under warranty, the maintenance and replacement of the equipment has proven to be very labor intensive. Although staff believes that the equipment failures are primarily due to design or manufacturing flaws, it is clear that the equipment at the parcourse is much more heavily used (and possibly abused) than at the manufacturer's other locations. Earlier, less sturdy versions of the same equipment have been in use at other locations in the Bay Area for several years with little to no issues.
- Once the manufacturer stops replacing damaged equipment under warranty, it is likely that as the equipment fails, funding and staffing constraints will necessitate replacement equipment with no moving parts.

Calendar Year 2011 Solid Waste Disposal Rate

- The Public Works Department has filed the annual solid waste report required by the California Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989. For calendar year 2011, the City of San Leandro is reporting a per capita disposal rate of 4.0 pounds per person per day. Although, the new methodology does not provide a percent diversion, based on the old methodology staff estimates the diversion rate to be approximately 77 percent. The disposal rate is well below the 8.7 pounds per person per day requirement set under the new disposal reporting system.
- Staff will continue to place their focus and resources on programs that divert solid waste from landfills and emphasize programs that reduce, reuse and recycle in effort to exceed the goal each reporting year.





QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

How much are the shots?

The flu shot is \$5, preservative free flu shot is \$30 (for those pregnant or allergic to thimerosal), Flu Mist is \$30 and the pneumonia shot is \$60.

If you are covered by Medicare, is your shot free?

If you are covered by Medicare Part B, there is no cost to you for the shot. Sutter Care at Home will bill Medicare for payment. We will verify coverage by checking the red, white and blue Medicare Part B card at the time of the shot.

Are Medicare HMOs the same as Medicare Part B?

No. If you are covered by a Medicare HMO, such as Pacificare, Medicare Advantage, Kaiser, SecureHorizons, Healthnet Seniority Plus, CHAMPUS, etc., you need to pay for your shot at the clinic or see your own health care provider for a shot.

What about non-Medicare insurance, such as Kaiser, PacifiCare, Healthnet or Blue Cross?

Other than Medicare Part B, Sutter Care at Home cannot bill insurance companies for a shot. If you do not have Medicare Part B coverage, you will need to pay in order to receive a shot at the clinic. Sutter Care at Home will provide a receipt for you to submit to your insurance company for possible reimbursement of all or part of what you've paid. Sutter Care at Home is not responsible for any difference between what you pay and what you may receive as reimbursement.

Do you give shots to children?

We provide shots for children ages 3 and above if accompanied by a parent or guardian. We provide FluMist for children 2 and above if accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Do you give shots to pregnant women?

We provide shots for pregnant women. In accordance with State regulations, we will provide preservative-free vaccine for pregnant women, as our supplies last. The cost for a preservative-free shot for a pregnant woman is \$30.

Who should receive a pneumonia shot?

Pneumonia vaccinations are recommended for those 65 years or older. Only one pneumonia shot is needed after age 65, if you have not received one before. If you received a pneumonia shot before you turned 65, you should get a booster shot after you turn 65. There should be five years between the initial shot and the booster. Please check with your doctor if you are unsure about whether you need a pneumonia vaccine.

What if this is my first flu shot?

If this is your first time receiving a flu shot, please plan on remaining at the clinic for 10 minutes after you get your shot, in the unlikely event that there is a reaction to the shot.

What is Sutter Care at Home?

Subject: City Council Follow-up

The San Leandro Unified School District's parcel tax ballot measure (Measure L) was on the City Council Agenda for discussion on September 4. There were two questions raised at the meeting that I was not able to answer completely so I want to provide you with the requested information prior to the next regular meeting of the City Council.

The first question concerned the total annual charge the average residential property owner would see on the tax bill for school projects and programs when Measure L passes. The average assessed valuation for a home in San Leandro is \$264,828. Therefore, the current total charge for schools is \$238 (\$2.64 x 89.94) per year. With the addition of the proposed parcel tax of \$39 per house, the new average charge for schools would be \$277 per year.

The annual parcel tax for an apartment building with 5 or more units is \$19 per dwelling unit; for commercial and industrial property the tax is \$.02 per square foot. A small business on a 6,000 sq.ft. parcel would pay an annual tax of \$120 and a large business on a 130,000 sq.ft. parcel (3 acres) would pay \$2,600 each year. The District's parcel tax will sunset in five years.

The second question concerns the growing gap in the School District's revenue and expenditures due to funding reductions by the State during the past five years. As shown on the attached chart the State has drastically reduced the Average Daily Attendance payment to the District; the graph that shows a difference between resources and needs as a result of the State take-a-ways amounting to over \$12 million since 2008.


