## CITY MANAGER MESSAGE

As we head into the summer season, I'd like to update you on the City budget. San Leandro is completing its first two-year budget, which we are set to provide the City Council for adoption in June. After a series of public discussions on City finances beginning in February, a new program has been approved by the City Council for one year – the Community Investment Program. This program is aimed toward community needs – critical social services, support for neighborhoods and specific business programs through the Chamber of Commerce. \$300,000 will be divided up to assist non-profits, help neighborhoods in areas of historic preservation, beautification, cultural events and partnerships, as well as provide the Chamber with funds to help local business and prepare for the Kaiser Hospital opening in 2014.

### Apply for Senior Clipper Card - May 24

The green Senior BART ticket is being replaced by the Senior Clipper card. On Friday, **May 24**, 1:00 p.m. – 3:00 p.m. at the Senior Community Center, 13909 East 14<sup>th</sup> Street, you will learn how to use the Clipper, an all-in-one-transit card that keeps track of multiple passes, ride books or tickets (which are specific to the transit system being used), as well as up to \$300 in cash value at one time, while applying all applicable fares, discounts and transfer rules. You must be 65 years or older to apply, and you must apply for a Senior Clipper card in person. BART staff will be accepting applications at this presentation and will issue free Clipper cards immediately. You will learn where and how to add cash value during the presentation.

Please bring one of the following forms of identification for proof of your eligibility: Birth Certificate, Driver's License issued by any state, Alien Registration/Permanent Resident Card, Matricula Consular/Consular Identification Card, Passport, Military/Dependent ID card with date of birth, or Medical Benefit Card with date of birth. 

# MANOR SHOPPING CENTER NEON SIGN RESTORED!

Mayor Stephen Cassidy announced recently that the historic Manor Shopping Center neon sign will be illuminated, for the first time in over 30 years, on **May 24, 2013**. The Optimist Club of San Leandro and the City of San Leandro split the \$13,400 cost of restoring the neon sign, with the City using funds from its Commercial Rehabilitation Program.

“The Manor Shopping Center neon sign is part of San Leandro’s history and adds to the beauty and character of the Washington Manor neighborhood,” stated Mayor Cassidy. “We are extremely thankful to the Optimist Club for its initiative and generous donation that made this project possible. We look forward to partnering with other community and private groups to preserve our history and enhance our neighborhoods.”

The sign is situated at the corner of Manor Boulevard and Farnsworth Street in the shopping center originally built in the 1950s. The current owner of the property,



Larry Fingerut, was 18 years old when he watched a large crane set the tall vertical piece of the sign in place. Fingerut had been working in his father’s shoe store at the time. After the original owner passed away in the 1970s, his heir sold the property to Fingerut, who has maintained ownership since. Fingerut recalled the sign was “visible from Bay-O-Vista” when it was lit. Unfortunately, significant damage was sustained at the top of the sign, compromising the sign’s viability, around the time the contracted neon company disbanded, and it has been dark since. Now, over 30 years later, no one is more excited about the refurbishing of the sign than Fingerut, who holds dear memories of the center, both as a young man and as a 60 year resident of the Manor.


## BATTERY RECYCLING

Did you know that the City of San Leandro offers free household battery recycling to residents? The City has partnered with businesses and community groups to provide drop-off locations throughout San Leandro. For battery recycling locations, click [here](#).

Residents can also recycle batteries through the curbside collection program. Place batteries in a clear Ziploc bag on top of the recycling cart on your regularly scheduled collection day.

You can recycle alkaline batteries, button batteries and rechargeable batteries marked **Pb, Ni-Zn, Ni-MH, Ni-Cd** and **L-ion**. Rechargeable batteries can be found in devices such as cell phones, cameras, laptop computers and power tools. Car batteries are not accepted.

## POLYSTYRENE FOAM SERVICE WARE ORDINANCE

The City of San Leandro's Polystyrene Foam Food Service Ware Ordinance went into effect on November 1, 2012. The Ordinance requires the City and local food establishments discontinue the use of polystyrene foam food service ware products. Polystyrene foam food service ware products include cups, bowls, plates, clamshell containers, soup containers and trays made from expanded foam polystyrene typically labeled #6.



The Ordinance does not prohibit the use of rigid plastic products including disposable utensils, drink lids, other non-foam lids, straws, and condiment containers. It also does not prohibit the use of foam trays used for packaging raw foods sold by markets and grocery stores.



Food establishments should refrain from purchasing plastic food service ware products labeled “biodegradable” or “compostable” often labeled #7 because these items are neither recyclable nor compostable in the City of San Leandro’s curbside collection program. Alternatives to foam food service ware include paper, aluminum, and recyclable plastic.

The ordinance helps improve our quality of life, the natural environment, our local waterways and wildlife. It also helps advance the City’s goal to divert 75% waste from landfill and to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 25% from 2005 levels by 2020.

The modern guzheng, Japanese koto, Korean gayageum and Mongolian yatga are developed from the traditional Chinese guzheng, making the instrument an extremely important piece of Asian musical culture.

Ms. Winnie Wong has been playing the guzheng since 1983 at the age of four and a half and started performing by the age of five. She has performed throughout California and in China. In 1990, Ms. Wong was promoted to the position of the Director of the San Francisco Guzheng Music Society's Youth Ensemble. 

## SLPD SHIFTS STAFFING TO SPECIALIZED UNIT TO ADDRESS CRIME

The San Leandro Police Department has created a new team of officers to provide the Department with the ability to quickly address emerging crime trends and problem areas identified through Crime Analysis. The Crime Suppression Unit will have a Lieutenant and two supervisors to manage and supervise the team of officers. This team will allow the Department to direct resources to a specific problem without continually diverting Patrol officers from responding to calls for service. The overriding philosophy of the Crime Suppression Unit is a proactive, no tolerance approach to crime which can be deterred from occurring through highly proactive and directed enforcement following creative problem oriented policing strategies. The Crime Suppression Unit will work in partnership with both internal and external stakeholders to educate members of the Department, City Employees and the community regarding crime trends and problems. They will also utilize available resources in its efforts to educate including social media, news/print media, educational pamphlets and community meetings to assist with the mission of deterring crime and improving the quality of life for the San Leandro community.
