Council Information

San Leandro City Junior Golf Championship (staff report attached)

- Each summer, since 1963, the San Leandro City Junior Golf Championship has been played at Monarch Bay Golf Club. Originally, this event had 30 to 40 participants, ages 7 to 17, from San Leandro and the immediate surrounding communities competing in this one-day event.
- This year, the San Leandro City Junior Golf Championship will be held on both courses at Monarch Bay on August 8. Over 160 entries have been received this year, again making the San Leandro City Junior Championship one of the largest junior golf tournaments in Northern California. The Junior Golf Championship runs smoothly due largely to the volunteers from American Golf and the San Leandro Golf Club at Monarch Bay
- The Public Works Department and American Golf continue to grow the game of golf by hosting various junior golf competitions at Monarch Bay. Other junior events include the High School Girls Spring Invitational and the High School Boys Fall Invitational.

Explorer Academy Graduation

- This past Saturday, explorers from San Leandro successfully completed and graduated from the 36th Annual Explorer Academy. This is a rigorous physical and educational program that is presented over an 8- day period and hosted by the San Diego County Law Enforcement Explorer Advisor Association. The Academy is attended by Law Enforcement agencies throughout California and held at the University of California - San Diego. Explorer advisors Det Khan, Dispatcher Megan Wilske and Officer Joey Bacon chaperoned our explorers. During the program, the advisors



have many roles and responsibilities. This year, Det Kahn even made it onto the [CBS 5 o'clock news](#).

- The program was funded this year through the Asset Forfeiture funds overseen by the Alameda County District Attorney's Office. These funds are dedicated to further youth programs in the community.

San Leandro Joins with Neighboring Cities on PG&E Economic Vitality Grant Application

- The City of San Leandro recently partnered with the City of Hayward, the Alameda County Economic & Civic Development Department, local Chambers of Commerce, the Hayward Chamber's Food Manufacturers Council, the Alameda County Workforce Investment Board (WIB), and the Small Business Development Center (SBDC) to submit an application for \$25,000 from PG&E. PG&E's Economic Vitality Grant Program invests in projects and programs that enhance local job creation and economic opportunity.
- The application proposed to use PG&E funds to provide services to increase employment opportunities in the food service manufacturing and distribution industry. We would use the funds to provide subsidized food safety training to unemployed residents to help them become qualified to work in the field. At the end of the training efforts, we the consortium proposes to host a regional employment event to connect local firms with the newly trained workforce.
- This application was spearheaded by the City of Hayward and reflects an acknowledgment of the significance of the food production industry in central Alameda County.

Compstat Report

- The Police Executive Research Firm (PERF) just released a [new report](#) that traces how police use of Compstat came into being, how it changed as it spread to hundreds of police agencies, and where it's headed for the future. The report, produced with support from the federal Bureau of Justice Assistance, is based on a PERF survey of law enforcement agencies, a national conference in which police executives described their experiences with Compstat, and PERF site visits to police departments across the country. The San Leandro Police Department's Compstat meetings are held bi-weekly and focus on the principles outlined in this report.

SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

This report is for information only, and no action is required.

BACKGROUND

Each summer, since 1963, the San Leandro City Junior Golf Championship has been played at Monarch Bay (formerly the San Leandro Golf Complex). Originally, this event had 30 to 40 participants, ages 7 to 17, from San Leandro and surrounding communities competing in this one-day event.

DISCUSSION

This year, the San Leandro City Junior Golf Championship will be held on both courses at Monarch Bay on August 8. Over 160 entries have been received this year, again making the San Leandro City Junior Championship one of the largest junior golf tournament in Northern California. The overall boy's champion in 2012 was Jimmy Castles from Cupertino with a score of 68 and the overall girl's champion was Elizabeth Shultz from Lafayette with a score of 71.

The continued success of the tournament is due largely to the volunteers from American Golf and the San Leandro Golf Club at Monarch Bay. The Public Works Department has managed this event since 1996. Under Public Works administration, this tournament has grown from 55 participants in 1995 to well over 300 participants in 2007. Due to the difficult economic times as well as competing junior golf events, participation at all junior golf tournaments are down from the peak year in 2007. However, even with the drop in participation this year, San Leandro City Junior Golf Championship remains one of the largest junior golf tournaments in Northern California.

CONCLUSION

The San Leandro City Junior Golf Championship has grown to be one of the largest single-day City Junior Golf Championships in California. The Public Works Department and American Golf continue to grow the game of golf by hosting various junior golf competitions at Monarch Bay. Other junior events include the High School Girls Spring Invitational and the High School Boys Fall Invitational. Over 400 juniors participate in golf events managed by the Public Works Department on an annual basis.
