## [Preferred Freezer Makes \\$50+ Million Investment in San Leandro](#)


The development of a 247,000 square foot deep freezer by Preferred Freezer at the 15-acre former Hudson Lumber site on San Leandro Boulevard is underway. Preferred Freezer designs, constructs and operates state-of-the-art temperature controlled warehouses throughout the United States and Asia.



During construction, over 300 jobs will be created, including those for the contractors, architects, engineers, and consultants. When the facility opens in June 2014, it will provide at least 50 quality jobs with that number increasing to 100 once fully staffed. This is a \$50 million investment, with on-going property tax revenue, and \$1.2 million in one-time permit and other fees to the City. [Read the full blog on SANLEANDRONEXT.COM.](#)

## [Momentum and Interest Growing in the Next Generation Workplace District](#)

On October 2, more than 100 people gathered at the Zero Net Energy Center for a presentation by Greg Tung of Freedman Tung + Sasaki and City of San Leandro staff on San Leandro's Industrial Area including recommendations for transforming it into a vibrant 21<sup>st</sup> Century workplace that will attract and retain advanced manufacturing and high tech companies and stimulate the creation of high paying jobs. The attendees represented a variety of stakeholders, ranging from large industrial business owners, property owners and real estate brokers to residents and small service oriented businesses. Mayor Stephen Cassidy [opened](#) the presentation discussing the history of our industrial zone and the opportunity to revitalize it.



The City is forming an Industrial Area Working Group, consisting of property owners, business owners and residents of the industrial area. The group will provide feedback and assist in the prioritization of the near-term recommendations from the Study. # BUSINESS LICENSE TAX HOLIDAY

is **free** for the first year!

September 1, 2013 through August 31, 2014, new businesses that are located in the City of San Leandro will pay no business license tax until 2015 and the zoning approval fee will be waived!

Please note: Although the fee is waived, it is still necessary for all businesses to obtain a business license.

# MONARCH BAY DRIVING RANGE UPGRADE

## *Newly Renovated Golf Club Facility Reopened October 6*

Major renovations have been completed at the Monarch Bay Golf Club driving range, located at 13800 Monarch Bay Drive near the San Leandro Marina. Renovations included a replacement of over 250,000 square feet of synthetic turf with new salt-tolerant natural sod, a new irrigation system, seven target greens, and various other new range amenities. This work comes on the heels of several other recent projects in the surrounding area, including the renovations of the Marina Park group picnic areas and the replacement of the Marina Park irrigation system.



Monarch Bay Golf Club includes the 9-hole Marina golf course, 18-hole Tony Lema golf course, 58 hitting station double-deck all-weather driving range and a full service clubhouse with restaurant and golf shop. Renovations began in mid-August and the range reopened to the public on October 6.

Historically, the 250,000 square foot driving range landing area was made of dirt, as grass could not grow in that area due to high salinity levels in the soil and water. In 1999, as part of a \$9 million renovation of the entire Monarch Bay Golf Club by American Golf Corporation, synthetic turf replaced the driving range dirt. After 14 years, the synthetic turf became worn out and needed to be replaced. With completion of this project, the range landing area will never need to be replaced again because the new paspalum strain of sod thrives in the unusual growing conditions at Monarch Bay. Also included in the range renovation are a new irrigation system (tied into the City's reclaimed water system), seven target greens and a host of other new range amenities. As a result of these features, the project serves to minimize the golf facility's use of fresh water.

American Golf Corporation has operated Monarch Bay Golf Club for the City since 1997. Past capital improvement projects at the facility include two pump station upgrades and the refurbishment of the two-story driving range structure. The price tag for these projects, including the current range renovation, is approximately \$800,000. The other surrounding improvements to the Marina Park picnic areas and the Monarch Bay irrigation system were completed using \$1,778,000 in Measure WW funding, the East Bay Regional Parks District bond measure that was authorized by voters in 2008. 



The purpose of the Academy is to provide attendees with a basic understanding of how the San Leandro Police Department works and its role in making San Leandro safer.
