#### **Presentation by Captain Lemmon – Active Shooter Training**

- Active Shooter Training – August 7 and 10, 2013 at San Leandro High
  - Participation by: Alameda County Fire Department, Paramedics Plus, San Leandro Unified School District, Union City Police Department Explorers, Pleasanton Police Department Explorers, San Leandro Police Department Explorers and many Volunteers
- Real Life Training Exercise for First Responders
  - Strengthen Communication Between Police and Rescue Personnel/Identify Expectations
- SLPD Active Shooter Training Consisted of 4 Hours Classroom Training/8 Hours On Scene Training
- Active Shooter Defined: An Individual Actively Engaged in Shooting People
- Shift in Philosophy – Both SWAT and Patrol to Respond
- Patrol's Response
  - Neutralize the Threat Immediately
  - Rescue Teams Respond – Paramedics/Fire Department
  - Set up Command Post

#### **Daytime Curfew**

- Daytime Curfew Implemented in 2007/Updated in 2012 – Comply with Law
- Studies Show Attendance at School has a Direct Effect on a Student's Education
- Daytime Curfew is a Vital Tool to Keep Kids in School – Parents Accountable for Truancy
- Penalty for Violating Daytime Curfew:
  - \$50.00 First Offense/\$100.00 Second Offense/\$200.00 Third Offense
  - In Lieu of Paying Fine – Diversion Program
- Minor Nighttime Curfew – 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.

#### **PST Program**

- Civilians in the Field to Maximize Coverage in City
- Civilian Multitalented in All Areas/Consolidate Positions:
  - Animal Control
  - Code Compliance/Code Enforcement
  - Jail/Prison Transport
  - Booking – Santa Rita/North County Jail
- Maximize Resources due to Budget Cuts
- Plan is for PST's to work 24 hours a day/7 day a week Coverage

- PST's will Include
  - PST I – New Recruit
  - PST II – Experience Performing Necessary Functions of Position
  - Sr. PST – Resource for PST I & PST II
- PST's will Free up Time for Officers to Attend to In Progress Crimes Creating a Better Deployment of our Resources
- Discussion on the Future of PST's Being 832 Certified/Ability to Carry a Firearm
