2013 Citizen's Police Academy Graduation


Wednesday, January 29, 6:30 p.m., City Council Chambers, San Leandro City Hall

- The Citizen Police Academy is an interactive program for residents, business people, and those with close ties to the San Leandro community that is designed to provide first-hand knowledge and experience about the operation of the San Leandro Police Department (SLPD).
- Academy participants attend 40 hours of training over a 13-week period, learning various aspects about law enforcement in San Leandro. Examples of training classes include: recruitment, hiring and training of personnel; public safety dispatching; patrol procedures; traffic education and enforcement; criminal investigations; firearms, use of force and less-lethal weapons; crime prevention; community outreach programs; the canine unit; media relations; and the Tactical Operations Team. Participants learn through this series of presentations and practical demonstrations that are provided by SLPD personnel. At the conclusion of the Citizen Police Academy, graduates will have an in-depth knowledge of the SLPD and its role in our community.


Help Friends of San Leandro Creek
