## CITY MANAGER MESSAGE



## CITY COUNCIL ADOPTS ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY AND WORK PLAN

On December 16, 2013 the San Leandro City Council adopted an Economic Development Strategy and Work Plan to guide economic development for the City. The Strategy includes a snapshot of San Leandro's economy and outlines nine initiatives designed to create a positive environment for investment in our community. The Strategy confirmed that San Leandro's economy continues to move in a very positive direction, with the unemployment rate at 6.9%, down from a high of over 11% just a few years ago. Sales tax revenue is steadily increasing, vacancy rates are at low levels, particularly in the industrial area, requests for building permits are rising and over 150 new businesses began operations in the past year, including BevMo! and Banana Republic. ## Auto Theft Prevention



**Taking precautionary measures can minimize your chances of becoming the victim of auto theft. In the United States a vehicle is stolen an average of every 44 seconds. Not only does auto theft cost the victim time and money, but it cost society as it drives insurance premiums up. Stolen vehicles are also commonly used to commit other crimes. Car thefts can occur anytime, so be alert and aware and follow these simple tips.**

Never leave your car running unattended, even to dash into a store, this occurs frequently in winter months as drivers leave the engine running to keep the car warm, all it takes is a split second and your car is gone!

- Never leave any keys in the car, the ignition, or in hide-a-key boxes - even inside a locked garage.
- Always roll up your windows and lock the car, even if it is parked in front of your home.
- **NEVER LEAVE VALUABLES IN PLAIN VIEW**, even if your car is locked. Remove garage door openers, GPS, GPS dock, cell phone, power cords and change/money in ashtray.
- Always park in high-traffic, well-lighted areas, whenever possible.
- Investigate the purchase of a vehicle theft tracking/security system, especially if you own one of the frequently stolen model vehicles such as a Honda Civic, Honda Accord, Nissan Maxima, Acura Integra or Ford Pickup.
- Never leave personal identification documents, such as the vehicle ownership title, insurance cards or credit cards in your vehicle.
- Do not store your home address in your GPS system, but rather use a nearby intersection or business address.
- If you must leave your key with a valet, attendant, or mechanic leave only the ignition key and not any house keys. Make sure you are dealing with a reputable firm, you can check with the Department of Consumer Affairs for more information.
- In high theft areas the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) should be etched on windows, doors, fenders and trunk lid. This makes it difficult for a thief to market your stolen car parts.
- Copy your license plate and vehicle information (VIN) numbers on a card and keep them with you. If your vehicle is stolen, the police will need this information to take a report.
- If your vehicle is stolen, report it to the police immediately!

## ATM "Skimming" Tips

ATM "Skimming" is an illegal activity that involves the installation of a device, usually undetectable by ATM users, that secretly records bank account data when the user inserts an ATM card into the machine. Criminals can then encode the stolen data onto a blank card and use it to steal money from the customer's bank account.



### HOW IT WORKS:

The criminal places the "Skimmer", which is usually made from plastic or plaster and looks very much like the original card reader, directly over the ATM card reader undetectable to the customer. As the customers insert their ATM cards into the false skimmer, their bank account information on the cards magnetic strip is "skimmed" or stolen and usually stored on some electronic device. A hidden camera is used in conjunction with the skimming device in order to record the customer's Personal Identification Number. In lieu of a hidden camera, a keypad overlay, placed directly over the installed keypad, is sometimes used to record the user punching in their PIN. The skimmer device is placed over the ATM card reader, undetectable to the customer.

**"Shoulder surfing"** once a customer is at the ATM screen, a person stands behind the victim and either watches for the PIN or moves closer and/or engages in conversation. Once the customer is finished, the ATM will ask if another transaction is wanted but most people don't realize that, they just walk off with the screen still accessible. With the question still on the screen, the thief steps up and answers "yes", enters the victim's PIN and withdraws cash.

**"Double swiping"** can occur at the ATM but the oldest and most common scam usually happens at a restaurant or retail shop. This involves someone swiping your card at the point of contact and then swiping it in a second device that captures the card number.

### HOW TO AVOID BEING SKIMMED:

- Inspect the ATM, gas pump, or credit card reader before using it. Be suspicious if you see anything loose crooked or damaged, or if you notice scratches or adhesive tape/residue. The original card reader is usually concave in shape (curving inward), while the skimmer is more convex (curving outward).
- When entering your PIN, block the keypad with your other hand to prevent possible hidden cameras or thieves from recording your number.
- Take an extra minute and remember to completely log off of the ATM screen.
- Be careful of ATMs in tourist areas - they are a popular target of skimmers.
- If your card isn't returned after the transaction or after hitting "cancel", immediately contact the financial institution that issued the card.
- Be aware of "Money Trapping", where the criminal attaches a device to the cash dispenser "trapping" the customer's money and retrieves it after the customer leaves the ATM area.
