## CITY MANAGER MESSAGE

Our Recreation and Human Services Department, as well as our Library Services Department, are preparing programs that celebrate our culture and history including African-American History Month, the Farmers' Market, Cinco de Mayo and the return of the beloved Cherry Festival. Please save the dates and enjoy! Community safety is teamwork and the 25 participants of this year's Citizen Police Academy should be commended for giving their time and energy to make San Leandro safer.


Another big date, San Leandro's push to add innovation and technology to our City is accelerating with the state of the art Kaiser Hospital set to open this June. We are working with our Chamber of Commerce and many private partners to create investment and quality jobs. Through LIT San Leandro, our high speed fiber network and vision of San Leandro's own Patrick Kennedy, we are becoming a special place for business here and those that are looking to invest. With \$2.1 million dollars from the Federal Economic Development Administration, LIT San Leandro is now being expanded from 11 miles ringing the center of the City to 18 miles including our shoreline and major malls, Bayfair and Westgate. In the meantime our now complete Next Generation Workplace District Study has been presented to the City Council for funding consideration and is exciting as it marries the opportunity of Kaiser to the endless possibilities of LIT San Leandro. We are also working with Peak Democracy to create virtual town hall meetings to further engage digital citizens - a program we will roll out very soon. Partners such as Comcast are promoting programs that help our students and bridge the digital divide by allowing low income families with children in school to connect to the Internet at significantly reduced rates. More to come as we seek to connect all of our students to a digital world.

This past month, the City Council held its annual Planning Session at the Main Library. Community involvement was very broad and ideas were heard. Some of the key themes included supporting those less fortunate, renewed vigor toward community art and culture and keeping business momentum strong. Also submitted was information from voters regarding the City's infrastructure and services. The public and City Council will receive a report on this session soon to guide the allocation of resources and services to our community.

# BUSINESS LICENSE TAX HOLIDAY

*September 1, 2013 through August 31, 2014, new businesses that are located in the City of San Leandro will pay no business license tax until 2015 and the zoning approval fee will be waived!*

Please note: Although the fee is waived, it is still necessary for all businesses to obtain a business license.

Celebrate African American History Month by enjoying a unique interactive performance that portrays **Sojourner Truth**, an American icon of freedom and human rights. Born in 1797 as "Isabella," a slave in New York, she ran away and became a free woman in 1827. She later became a powerful and charismatic speaker. In 1843, she had a spiritual awakening, and turned to preaching under her chosen name, Sojourner Truth. Truth's spiritual journey brought her into contact with abolitionists such as Frederick Douglass and women's rights activists such as Elizabeth Cady Stanton. Although she never learned to read or write, with the help of a friend she published her life and beliefs in 1850 in her *Narrative of Sojourner Truth*, which brought her national recognition.

In 1851, Truth went on a nation-wide lecture tour and at a women's rights conference in Akron, Ohio, she gave her most resounding and inspiring "Ain't I a Woman?" speech. This speech has its own place in history as one of the most famous women's rights speeches.

During the Civil War, Truth helped draft African American men to join the Union. When the war ended, Truth met with Abraham Lincoln to thank him for ending slavery. Sojourner Truth never ceased lecturing for the rights of African Americans and of women. She died in 1883 at the age of 86.



**Jamie P. Myrick** is an educator and storyteller who strives to teach people of all ages the stories of women who helped shape America. She is also a teacher consultant and a theatre instructor as well as an instructor for the elementary, middle and high school levels at West Contra Costa Unified School District.





## SLPD GRADUATES ITS 2013-14 CITIZEN POLICE ACADEMY CLASS

On Wednesday, January 29, the San Leandro Police Department celebrated the graduation of 25 community members who successfully completed the 13-session Citizen Police Academy. Beginning in October, Academy participants attended more than 40 hours of training in a variety of classes that were hosted on a weekly basis, learning about the law enforcement profession and the San Leandro Police Department's role in the community.



The concept of a Citizen Police Academy first began in 1977 in England. The first class in the United States started in Orlando, FL in 1985. Several years ago, San Leandro began to offer the program to its community and business leaders, which has proven to be a very successful community outreach program.

“The Academy gives us an opportunity to educate our community about SLPD’s daily operations. While showcasing our Department and employees, we also have the opportunity to broaden people’s perspectives, while continuing to build strong partnerships with our community,” said Lt. Robert McManus, the class facilitator.

Some of the training classes included: the selection and hiring of employees, the 9-1-1 communications center, patrol and investigative procedures, crime prevention and community outreach programs, ethics in law enforcement, volunteer programs, firearms demonstrations and tactical operations. Academy participants learned through practical demonstrations, lectures and discussions, presented by SLPD personnel.

Chief Sandra Spagnoli praised the graduates for their dedication and commitment and for taking the time to learn about their police department. She stated, “The continued involvement of the San Leandro community is one of the main reasons why I enjoy serving as your Police Chief. I look forward to continuing to build partnerships with our community through programs like this. They are effective in reducing crime in San Leandro, making this community safer for everyone.”


## ***Stopwaste.org Benchmark Service Report***

*How do our recycling efforts measure up?*

A new benchmark service from StopWaste, Alameda County's solid waste management authority, is intended to help residents achieve our community recycling goals.

Alameda County households reduced the percentage of recyclable or compostable materials in their garbage carts from 60% to 42% between 2008 and 2012. Progress has been made, but there still remains more to be done. The

Benchmark Service helps by measuring and reporting on our progress every year.



The first Benchmark Service report was mailed in late January 2014. Future reports will be sent at least once per year. To fund the benchmark service, StopWaste is now assessing an annual fee of \$1.81 on all residential and commercial garbage accounts in Alameda County, which became effective July 1, 2013. The annual fee is included in customer waste hauling bills. Residents may unsubscribe to the service by contacting StopWaste at [www.stopwaste.org/benchmark](http://www.stopwaste.org/benchmark) or by calling (877) 786-7927. Requests to unsubscribe received after March 31, 2014 may not be approved.
