Successful Town Hall Meeting for Districts 3, 4, & 6 Held on Monday July 14th

- This past Monday evening, July 14, 2014, Mayor Cassidy, Vice-Mayor Lee and Council Members Souza and Prola hosted a successful Town Hall meeting in the Titan Auditorium room of the Marina Community Center. The meeting included an informative presentation from Caltrans on the Marina Blvd and Davis Street overpass projects, as well as a public safety update from the San Leandro Police Department. The meeting also provided ample time for community members to share their opinions and ask questions on a range of topics concerning city government.

- Looking ahead, the Community Development Department will be hosting a Town Hall devoted to the Housing Element Update on Wednesday July 30th from 6:00 – 8:00 pm at the Senior Center. A Transportation Town Hall also is tentatively scheduled for the evening of Monday, September 22nd.

2014 Esri International User Conference

- At this week's 2014 Esri International User Conference in San Diego, OSISOFT will present exciting accomplishments regarding its ongoing working partnership with the City's Public Works and Information Technology Departments.
- OSISOFT has partnered with the City to install its "PI" software system that will monitor real-time data from across the city, using the high-speed fiber network to connect buildings that are miles apart. This system is presently monitoring local weather conditions, air quality levels, fiber network responsiveness, AC transit buses, and interior building data. That data ultimately will assist city engineers and facilities managers with their work and will facilitate long-term goals such as monitoring and managing emergency response teams and achieving more efficient heating, ventilation, and air conditioning practices.
- The Esri conference provides an opportunity to showcase San Leandro's fiber network and its many opportunities for practical applications to an international audience. The City is appreciative for the opportunity to work on this pilot project with OSISOFT, which has not required any City funding.

TEEN ACADEMY





Founded in 2006 by **Gautam Tejas Ganeshan**, the Sangati Center has hosted more than 400 public chamber concerts of Indian classical music. Sangati Center concerts are distinguished by being presented strictly acoustically, with nothing amplified or plugged in, and with humans rather than electricity being responsible for the sound - recalling an age-old approach where musicianship retains the focus in lieu of elaborate production.
