Chief's Advisory Board Meeting Notes Tuesday, July 29, 2014

Presentation by Lt. Randy Brandt – Armored Rescue Vehicle

- Designed for any High Risk Situation Where Someone May be Armed and any Tactical Situation Where the Use of the Vehicle Would Help to Rescue People Entering a Dangerous Zone Without Jeopardizing the Lives of Officers
- The San Leandro Police Department Partnered with Alameda County Fire Department, Fremont Police and Fire Department and Applied for the State Homeland Security Grant
 - Request to Purchase 2014 Lenco Bearcat
 - Fully Equipped Vehicle Cost \$275,000/Annual Maintenance \$1,000 a Year
 - Goal is to Acquire an Armored Rescue Vehicle Utilizing Grant Funding and Asset Forfeiture Funds Ultimately Providing Safety to All Community Members
 - Current Status – Possible \$200,000 Funding from Grant
- Armored Rescue Vehicle Provides a Safe and Secure Environment for Police Personnel to Drive Through an Active Scene to Safely Rescue Citizens and Administer Medical Aid
- Discussed Response Types in Critical Incidents– Advanced Preparation is Vital
 - Pre-Planned/Prior Intelligence
 - Emergency
- Reviewed Tactical Trends in the City of San Leandro to Assess the Need for an Armored Rescue Vehicle
- Justifications and Advantages:
 - SWAT Audit Made a Recommendation to Purchase Armored Rescue Vehicle
 - Ideal to Rescue Citizens/Staff
 - Provide a Secure Platform for Deployment of our Officers, Negotiations, and to Resolve Incidents
- Reviewed Local Events Where an Armored Vehicle Would Provide Substantial Rescue Benefit
- Discussed Areas in San Leandro that Would Benefit From Having This Equipment Available in the Event of a Critical Incident

Round Table Discussion – Member's Comments

- Open Discussion on the Chief's Advisory Board Members Role in Providing Feedback to Develop Policies, Preparing the San Leandro Police Department in Presenting Items to Council, and Their Assistance in the Hiring/Promotional Process
- Board Expressed Interest in How the Armored Vehicles are Regulated for Purchase by the Public
 - Inquired About the Tires on the Armored Rescue Vehicle – Lt. Brandt Confirmed They Can Sustain Bullets

- Discussed Operational Red Light Camera on Marina Blvd. and How Video is Reviewed By SLPD Personnel to Determine if Violation Occurred
- Discussed the Status of Outer Carriers
 - SLPD Has Finalized the Prototype
 - Working on the Training Component & Considering Purchasing Guidelines
- Body Camera Update
 - Feedback From Chief's Advisory Board Was Used in Developing Language for Policy
 - Management Team Set Administrative Parameters to Determine Viewing Rights
 - Training & Field Testing to be Completed by September 2014
- Board Expressed Interest in Armored Rescue Vehicle
 - Dual Purpose Vehicle – Medical/Tactical
- Feedback From Chief's Advisory Board Members - Provide Perspective on Many Issues Prior to the San Leandro Police Department Approaching City Council
- Comments About Feeling More Comfortable Living in the Community Serving as a Chief's Advisory Board Member
- Expressed Feedback that SLPD is Not on the Public Scanner Frequency
 - Advised the County is Currently Updating Radio System – EBRCS System
- Discussed Status of Captain Interviews – Scheduled for August 21st
 - Recruitment Extended Through August 1st
