Statistic Sheet

- Members of the Chief's Advisory Board Reviewed a Draft Sample of a Statistic Sheet to Provide a Snapshot of Administrative Statistics
 - Draft is Collective of Several Different Agencies
 - Currently the Goal is to Capture at Least 2 Years of Data to Monitor Complaints and Their Findings, Use of Force, Pursuits, Etc.
 - In the Future the Statistic Sheet Should Track 5 Year Trend
 - Upon Completion the Stat Sheet Will be an External Document to be Shared With the Community
 - The Statistical Sheet Will Also Serve as an Internal Risk Management Tool to Help Establish Policies/Practices in the Future
 - Requested Members to Provide Their Feedback/Suggestions to Administrative Specialist, Nitza Menagias

 - For 2016 – He Recommended the Board Discuss The Impact of Social Media

 - For 2016 – Continue the Educational Component With the Youth
- Suggested for 2016 That SLPD Focus on Noise Pollution
- Participation in the Chief’s Advisory Board and Citizen’s Academy Has Created a Deeper Appreciation For Law Enforcement
