

SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

Staff seeks residents of Districts 2, 3, 4 and 6 to fill four vacancies on the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC). Staff will review applications and then will make a formal recommendation to Council.

This report is for information only and no action is required.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

A temporary Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC), established in December 2009, successfully guided staff and consultants in updating the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan (Plan) over nine months. The Planning Commission's approved the Plan on November 18, 2010 and City Council adopted the Plan on February 7, 2011, at which time a permanent Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) was established.

The purpose of the BPAC is to continuously guide the development and implementation of the City's Bicycle and Pedestrian facilities and to ensure that bicycle and pedestrian issues are addressed and options developed in a timely fashion for network expansion. This committee also provides a forum for public feedback and input on the City's Measure B and BB Bicycle and Pedestrian funded projects, per the requirements of the Alameda County Transportation Commission (ACTC). The BPAC will also be instrumental in updating our current Bicycle and Pedestrian Master starting later this year.

Following is a summary of the key elements of the BPAC:

Committee Name: Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee
Membership: Eleven Member Committee

No age limit for BPAC members and at least one member shall represent each Council District. The selected members shall represent both bicyclist and pedestrian issues and be approved by the City Council.

Responsibilities: BPAC is charged with advising staff on matters relating to the status and condition of bicycle and pedestrian facilities within the City.

Meetings: Meetings of the BPAC are held on an as-needed basis. BPAC generally meets once or twice a year.
