#### PG&E Testing Natural Gas Pipeline on Washington Ave between Fargo Ave & San Leandro Blvd.

On May 10, 2016, PG&E began performing hydrostatic pressure testing on their natural gas pipeline located on Washington Ave. between Fargo Ave. and San Leandro Blvd. As part of these efforts, PG&E crews will be working near the following intersections of Washington Avenue: Fargo Avenue, Floresta Avenue and San Leandro Boulevard. Work is expected to continue into June. Weather and other factors affecting safe working conditions may impact this work schedule.
