The San Leandro Police Department is Working on Establishing a Policy to Utilize the Alameda County Sheriff's Office's Drone Also Known As an Unmanned Aerial System

Presentation by Alameda County Sheriff's Office – Captain Madigan **Unmanned Aerial System (UAS) Operations**

- Captain Madigan Passed Around a Drone For the Board Members to See
 - The Same Type Of Drone That Can Be Purchased at Best Buy
- Unmanned Aerial System Operations Are a Cost Effective Tool For Public Safety
 - Provides an Effective Way to Respond to Emergency Situations
 - Eye in the Sky Viewpoint – Better View Than From a Helicopter
 - Device Can Be Sent Before a Real Person into a Critical Situation
 - Save Lives – Help Locate Missing Persons
 - Access Areas You Can't Reach
 - Provide Assistance to Firefighters
 - Search and Rescue Team
 - Explosive Ordinance Disposal
 - Assist Divers – Fly Above Water
 - Special Response Unit
 - Mutual Aid
 - Drones May Not Be Utilized in Large Crowds
 - Drones Do Not Record Voices or Sound

- Utilization of the Unmanned Aerial System Operations is Regulated
 - There Are a Lot of Restrictions Pertaining to Where a Drone Can Be Flown
 - Flown During Daylight
 - Coordinate With Air Traffic Control
 - Flown At Or Below 400 Feet
 - In Line of Sight 2000 Feet
 - Flown by Pilot and Ground Observer
 - File Notice to Airmen (NOTAMS – Federal Aviation Administration)
- Alameda County Sheriff's Office Had Multiple Meetings
 - Community Outreach
 - Public Meetings/Presentations
 - Surveys
 - Formal Presentation Alameda County Board of Supervisors' Public Protection Committed
 - Press Conferences

 - Drones Are Always Charged and Ready For Use Everyday

 - Critical Incident Involving an Armed Suspect

Review SLPD Draft Policy – Unmanned Aerial System (UAS) Operations

- The Board Reviewed the Draft Policy and Provided Their Feedback Regarding the Utilization of Drones in San Leandro
 - Concern About Privacy
 - Educate the Community That Drones Will Only Be Utilized in Emergency Situations
 - Clear and Concise Policy to Identify When a Drone May Be Utilized
- The Board Took a Vote – 11 Members Present
 - Unanimous Decision in Support of SLPD Utilizing Drones
