MedEvac Vehicle

- First Deployment Today, Tuesday, October 4, 2016
 - A Man Barricaded Himself in his Car Armed With Knives
 - MedEvac Vehicle Was Used to Block the Man's Vehicle In Allowing Officers to Negotiate With the Suspect
 - Suspect Came Out With a Weapon in Hand
 - Officers Were Able to Use Less Lethal Options and No One Got Hurt
- Chief's Advisory Board Members Toured the MedEvac Vehicle
- MedEvac Vehicle Specifications
 - Ford F-550 Super Duty Chassis – 20 ft. (Length), 10 ft. (Width), 17,000 lbs.
 - Diesel Engine, 6.7L Turbo
 - Front Mounted Receiver With Ram Post and Plate
 - Hydraulic Ram Upgrade
 - Gas Injector Unit
 - AC-DC Power Inverter 3,600 Watt w/Battery Charge Feature
 - Back Up Camera System With Monitor
 - Roof Mounted Remote Control Spot Lights
 - Rear Auxilliary AC/Heating System
 - 22.5" Tire and Wheel Upgrade
 - Whelen LED Liberty Light Bar
 - On Board Oxygen Tanks, Lighted Work Stations, and Ample Compartments for Medical Supplies
 - 5 Inch Thick Steel Armored Bodywork Built to Withstand 7.62 AP/.50 Cal BMG
 - Includes Fire Nozzle
- Funded by a Grant from the State Homeland Security in the Amount of \$200,000
 - Remaining \$100,000 Funded by Grant Partners: Alameda County Fire, Fremont Police/Fire and San Leandro Police
- Countywide Asset
- Vehicle is Specially Designed to:
 - Safely Transport and Protect Emergency Medical Personnel and Their Equipment Into High Threat Environments
 - Protect the Community and First Responders When Confronted With Violent and/or Armed Individuals
- Time is of the Essence During Critical Incidents and Seconds Count – Vehicle Will Provide Assistance in Violent Incidents to Safely Transport and Protect Emergency Medical Personnel
 - Active Shooters
 - Acts of Terrorism

- All Deployments are Tracked
 - The San Leandro Police Department Maintains a Vehicle Usage Log and After Action Reports to Track the MedeVac's Usage
 - The City Council Also Receives Notifications When the Vehicle is Being Used
- All Sworn Personnel Will Be Trained
- The Board Received a Copy of the San Leandro Police Department Rescue Vehicle Policy
 - This Policy Governs SLPD's Use, Training, and Storage of the MedEvac Rescue Vehicle
 - Other Agencies Follow Their Own Policy
 - The San Leandro Police Department's Policy Prohibits the Use of This Vehicle for Peaceful Protests
- The MedEvac Rescue Vehicle Allows Officers to Get Closer to Subjects Safely

Roundtable

- A Community Member Inquired if the Chief is Planning on Sending Another Community Letter
 - Chief Tudor Responded to Advise He is Aware of the Current Climate but is Not Planning on Sending Another Letter at This Time
- Board Members Made Inquiries on the Status of the Interim Police Chief Position Becoming Permanent
 - Chief Tudor Responded to Advise He Has Been Interim for 6 Months and City Manager Has Discretion to Appoint Permanent Chief
- Additional Feedback on the City Council Presentation
 - Public Comments Was Limited to Only 1 Speaker
 - Indication That Presentation Was Thorough
 - Speaker Provided Great Feedback
