At 10:20 a.m. on Thursday, 10/20/11, most City offices will be participating in the Great California ShakeOut 2011. A statewide exercise that has now grown to be nationwide and even international, ShakeOut is an annual opportunity for organizations to practice emergency preparedness measures. At that moment, an alarm will sound in most City facilities to simulate that an earthquake has just occurred. Employees and visitors will "Duck, Cover, and Hold On," just as if an earthquake had actually occurred. Then everyone will evacuate their buildings to predetermined assembly areas according to the City's Emergency Action Plan. Then at noon, a brown bag lunch training session on Personal Emergency Preparedness will be offered for employees in the City Council Chambers, followed by voluntary training on the use of home fire extinguishers. Both of these trainings are being offered by the Alameda County Fire Department.

Community Meeting on City Council Redistricting and City Manager Selection

- The second of two meetings has been scheduled to seek the community's input on two important matters – redistricting of City Council districts, and characteristics and qualifications of the ideal future City Manager for San Leandro. The meeting scheduled for October 19 will cover both topics.
- Redistricting of City Council Districts generally comes every ten years, after the US Census has been completed and new Census tracts show shifts in the City's population. The City Council strives to balance the number of residents within each Council district.
- Also, the recruitment for a new City Manager for San Leandro is underway and the community is encouraged to give recommendations for the qualities and qualifications desirable in a new City Manager. Council Information

San Leandro Police Department (SLPD) September Crime Statistics (attached)

- Chief Spagnoli has provided the city's crime statistics for the first 9 months of 2011.
- Overall, crime this year is slightly higher year-to-date than last year, but well below average range for the last five years. Last year San Leandro hit a 30-year low in the crime rate, and it is not surprising there is a slight increase this year since this is consistent with the crime trend across the United States. Larceny and robberies have slightly increased. SLPD's crime prevention efforts continue to focus on theft prevention for businesses and residents.

Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation Agency Tree Removal Work at Saint Mary Avenue (staff report and flyer attached)

- The Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation Agency, which is responsible for maintenance of San Leandro Creek, will begin its planned tree removal and pruning next month, starting near Saint Mary Avenue adjacent to the San Leandro Creek. Work is expected to start on October 17 and last for three weeks, depending on weather and other unforeseen conditions.
- The Agency has been coordinating this project with the City and the community for more than a year in order to ensure a safe and cost effective project while minimizing the impacts to residents of the neighborhood. Alameda County Flood Control held six (6) neighborhood meetings in an effort to alert the residents about the upcoming project and impacts.

Alameda Countywide Transportation Plan Interactive Workshop – Alameda CTC (staff report and flyer attached)

- The Alameda County Transportation Commission (CTC) will host an interactive workshop about the Alameda Countywide Transportation Plan (CWTP) update and development of a new Transportation Expenditure Plan (TEP) on **October 19 from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.** at the San Leandro Senior Community Center.
- The CWTP is a long-range policy document that guides transportation funding decisions for Alameda County's transportation system over a 25-year horizon. The CWTP serves as Alameda County's input to the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) in their development of the Regional Transportation Plan, which is also underway in 2011. The sales tax TEP (currently Measure B) is another key source of funding for transportation projects and programs in Alameda County. Projects and programs for the expenditure plan are drawn from the CWTP.

Legislative News

Green Pathways: Reducing Urban Sprawl & Traffic Congestion (SB 310)

- East Bay commuters know about clogged roads and freeways and the detrimental effect on our communities from urban sprawl. Lani Hancock introduced SB 310 to do something about it, and Governor Brown has now signed it into law.
- The new law provides incentives to developers to build within one-half mile of existing transit stations. It is designed to encourage environmentally sound development that increases transit ridership, reduces vehicle traffic on the highways, and pays prevailing wage.

Alameda County Fire Department Urban Shield (press release and postcard attached)


- **Saturday/Sunday, October 15/16, 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., ACFD Training Tower, 890 Lola Street**







AGENCY TREE REMOVAL WORK AT SAINT MARY AVENUE

SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

The Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation Agency will be conducting tree removal and pruning near Saint Mary Avenue adjacent to the San Leandro Creek. Work is expected to start on October 17 and last for three weeks depending on weather and other unforeseen conditions.

This report is for information only, and no action is required.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation Agency is responsible for maintenance of the San Leandro Creek and has a number of large trees that need to be cut or removed due to potentially hazardous conditions created by these trees. Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation Agency has been coordinating this project with the City for several months in order to ensure a safe and cost effective project while minimizing the impacts to residents of the neighborhood. Alameda County Flood Control held six (6) neighborhood meetings in an effort to alert the residents about the upcoming project and impacts. The tree trimming work will start at the south end Saint Mary Avenue, followed by the west end of Cary Drive at the creek and then on to Huff Avenue adjacent to the creek. The City will issue an encroachment permit and oversee traffic control and restoration of the public right of way.

Work will take place Monday thru Friday between 8:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m., with no work on weekends. Trucks will access the site during construction hours from Interstate 880 to Davis Street, along East 14th Street to Dutton and on to Saint Mary Avenue to haul tree limbs and trunks.

Due to the size of the trees, large equipment will be onsite during construction hours. This equipment will be onsite at the end of Saint Mary Avenue and may temporarily restrict access to some driveways to accommodate removal of large trees and limbs. During construction hours, no parking will be allowed 300 feet from the end of Saint Mary Avenue. At the end of each working day, no construction equipment will be left in the neighborhood and parking will be restored.

Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation Agency will be distributing the attached flyer to residents within the project vicinity this week. The flyers for other locations will be forwarded when the schedule has been confirmed.

Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (District) will be conducting tree removal and pruning work along San Leandro Creek in the vicinity of Saint Mary Avenue. The following construction information is provided for reference:

Anticipated Construction Schedule

- ❖ Start date: October 17, 2011
- ❖ Duration: Up to three weeks, subject to change due to weather and unforeseen conditions.
- ❖ Construction hours: 8:30 AM to 5:30 PM, Mondays thru Fridays. No work on weekends.
- ❖ Truck haul route: along Saint Mary Avenue to Dutton Avenue to East 14th Street to Davis Street to I-880 Freeway. Truck hauling will take place during construction hours only.

During Construction Hours

- ❖ No parking will be allowed for approximately 300 feet from the end of Saint Mary Avenue, to provide construction staging area.
- ❖ Construction equipment will be staged at the end of St. Mary Avenue.
- ❖ Trucks will be traveling in and out of Saint Mary Avenue, hauling tree trunks and limbs.
- ❖ During the work hours, some driveway access may be temporarily restricted to accommodate the removal of large tree trunks and limbs.

After Construction Hours

- ❖ No construction equipment will be parked or staged on public streets unless approved by the City of San Leandro.
- ❖ The street will be clear of construction equipment at the end of each day, and any parking restrictions along curb side will be restored after 5:30 PM.

SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

The Alameda County Transportation Commission (CTC) will host an interactive workshop about the Alameda Countywide Transportation Plan (CWTP) update and development of a new Transportation Expenditure Plan (TEP) on Wednesday October 19, 2011 from 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm at the San Leandro Senior Community Center.

BACKGROUND

The Alameda Countywide Transportation Plan (CWTP) is a long-range policy document that guides transportation funding decisions for Alameda County's transportation system over a 25-year horizon. The CWTP serves as Alameda County's input to the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) in their development of the Regional Transportation Plan, which is also underway in 2011. The sales tax Transportation Expenditure Plan (TEP) (currently Measure B) is another key source of funding for transportation projects and programs in Alameda County. Projects and programs for the expenditure plan are drawn from the CWTP.

To develop the CWTP/TEP, Alameda CTC is working with a Steering Committee, Community Advisory Working Group and Technical Advisory Working Group. These committees include representatives from fifteen local jurisdictions, six transit operators, Caltrans District 4, the Port of Oakland, MTC and other community and agency stakeholders to identify and prioritize projects and programs. The Alameda CTC last hosted a public workshop on the CWTP on March 16, 2011 at the Karp Room in the Main Library. Now that the Alameda CTC has completed the first draft of the CWTP it will be presented at a series of public workshops.

DISCUSSION

The Alameda CTC is hosting the second of two rounds of interactive workshops to provide feedback on the Draft CWTP. The workshop will be held at the San Leandro Senior Community Center on October 19, 2011 from 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm. This workshop is one of five that are being held throughout Alameda County. The workshops will provide an overview of the CWTP and TEP and present preliminary TEP project, program and financial information. Additionally the workshop will have an interactive segment where participants will take part in prioritizing transportation improvements.
